

Browns Reserve Draft Concept Plan

CONSULTATION PROCESS

October - November 2023

BACKGROUND

The City of Greater Dandenong have undertaken preparation of a Draft Concept Plan for Browns Reserve, Noble Park North. Improvements to this reserve were identified as a priority action from the Greater Dandenong, Open Space Strategy 2020-2030.

CONSULTATION

Greater Dandenong City Council asked the community to have their say on the Draft Concept Plan at Browns Reserve.

The community consultation on the Draft Concept Plan was open for a four-week period Online via the 'Have your say' website from Thursday 2 October until Sunday 5 November 2023. Various methods were used to promote and seek feedback on the Draft Concept Plan.

Council advertised the Draft Concept Plan via the City of Greater Dandenong 'Have Your Say' website with links to SurveyMonkey.

The consultation included:

- Notification posters erected at Browns Reserve
- Information on Council's website, 'Have Your Say'
- Online survey via Survey Monkey.
- 549 x A4 mailout fliers delivered to the catchment around Browns Reserve
- In-class workshop with 25 students from St Elizabeth's Primary School (Monday 30 October), and a workshop with students from Dandenong South Primary School.

In total there were 66 responses to the online survey for the draft Concept Plan. The online survey response were a compilation of the community members and the feedback received from the St Elizabeth Primary School and Dandenong South Primary School students.


CONSULTATION OUTCOMES DRAFT CONCEPT PLAN ONLINE SURVEY

October -November 2023

The feedback on the draft concept plan has been informed by the community's feedback and the school workshop with the students from St Elizabeth's Primary School.

At St Elizabeth's Primary School there were twenty-five (25) students and one teacher who participated in the classroom presentation. The students were part of the school's leadership group which included children from prep to grade 6. The workshop was facilitated by Council's Children's Services Development Officer, and Council's Senior Landscape Architect and at Dandenong South Primary School, Council's Children's Services Development Officer facilitated the workshop. The in-class presentations on the Draft Concept Plan were based on the online survey monkey questions. However, the workshops allowed for conversations between the students and delved further into the detail of the concept plan. Following this 'deep dive,' the students were then asked to review the draft concept plan and were asked whether they agreed or had further suggestions on how the plan could be improved. There was also an opportunity for the students to provide drawings on their ideas.

The feedback from the in-class workshops has been combined with the broader community feedback and entered into the online survey monkey data to inform and develop the revised draft Concept for Browns Reserve.



Q1 Do you generally agree with the draft concept plan?

Overall, there was a high level of support for the direction of the concept plan at Browns Reserve. In addition, the written responses in Question 2, identified further ideas for the park and playground.



Extracted comments from the survey are as follows:

There was a very high level of community support for the basketball and soccer (futsal) goal combination.




Q4 If you answered 'None of the above', please tell us why




Basket swing



Standard and toddler seat



There was almost an equal level of support for both the small play unit with a slide and the cube with the climbing element and the slide.




There were seven (7) comments on this question. Of the seven responses, the additional comments with playground equipment suggestions were:

When correlated with the response to Q8, there was a higher level of support for a cube element with some climbing elements and slides. The small play unit with a slide is suited to younger children, which is also important to consider for inclusion.








The highest level of support was for the 'brights' colour palette.

Q18 Is there any other feedback you would like to provide?


There were twenty-nine (29) separate comments provided to this question. Refer to Appendix 1 for details of all collected responses. Notably, the themes that have been extracted from these comments correlate with the comments received against Q2.

Most of the comments received were requests to expand and diversify the playground equipment.

Of the survey entries received, only forty-seven, of the sixty-six provided feedback on this question. Most of the feedback was from people over eighteen years old.

However, there was a strong representation within the 11-17 age bracket as well as the younger primary school aged children of 6-10 years who were participants from the local schools. Overall, the feedback to each question is captured in the survey responses and reflective of a diverse range of age groups.

SUMMARY COUNCIL'S RESPONSE TO CONSULTATION OUTCOMES

Overall, there was strong support to make improvements to Browns Reserve, especially the upgrade to the playground, increasing the activities within the park and enhancing the park's landscape amenity. The main themes and ideas that emerged from the community's comments to the survey have provided council officers with clear direction on the revised design for this park.

The revised concept plan is aligned with the following parameters:

- 1. Allocated budget for 2023-2024 financial year
- 2. Feedback received from the community (survey and comments)
- 3. Neighbourhood level park Greater Dandenong Open Space Strategy 2020-2030 Park Development Standards
- 4. Local level playground
- 5. Staging plan to inform future capital improvement works bids to Council

Stage 1 Works - 2023-24

New local level playground – A high proportion of the feedback received was in support of the playground being renewed and making further improvements to the playground design with a more diverse range of equipment provided.

- Special swing basket swing
- Multi-play equipment climbing cube with slides
- Rubber colour green colour or pink/blue colour mix
- Post and pole colours 'brights'
- Colour of slides blue and a green shade

The construction of a new local playground is aligned with the Playground Strategy 2020-23 Action Plan. The existing playground was constructed in 2000 and is due for replacement.

Shelter for the bbq and picnic area

Picnic table and seats and park seats – The expansion of the picnic and bbq area will complement the new playground. These facilities were seen as an important addition to the park for community and family gatherings.

Tree Planting – The tree planting will increase the provision of shade and increase canopy coverage across the reserve.

Future Stage Works - Subject to Council funding

The following projects are subject to separate future capital improvement bids being supported through council's annual budget process.

- A BBQ
- Drinking fountain
- Practice court with basketball and futsal goals. The court surface would be either blue/blue/red or blue/green/blue with the final colour mix to match with the playground colour theme.
- Garden beds with indigenous planting
