

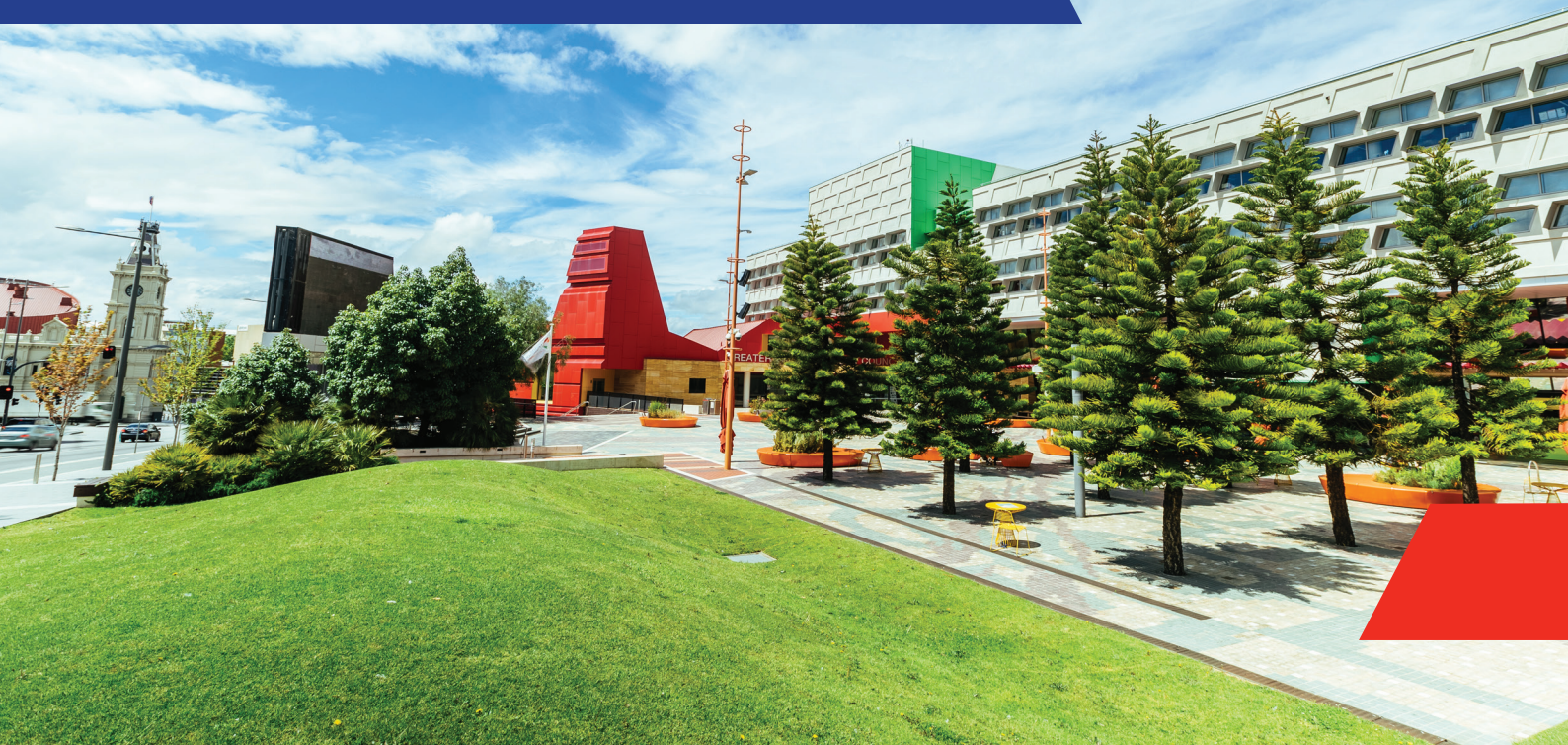

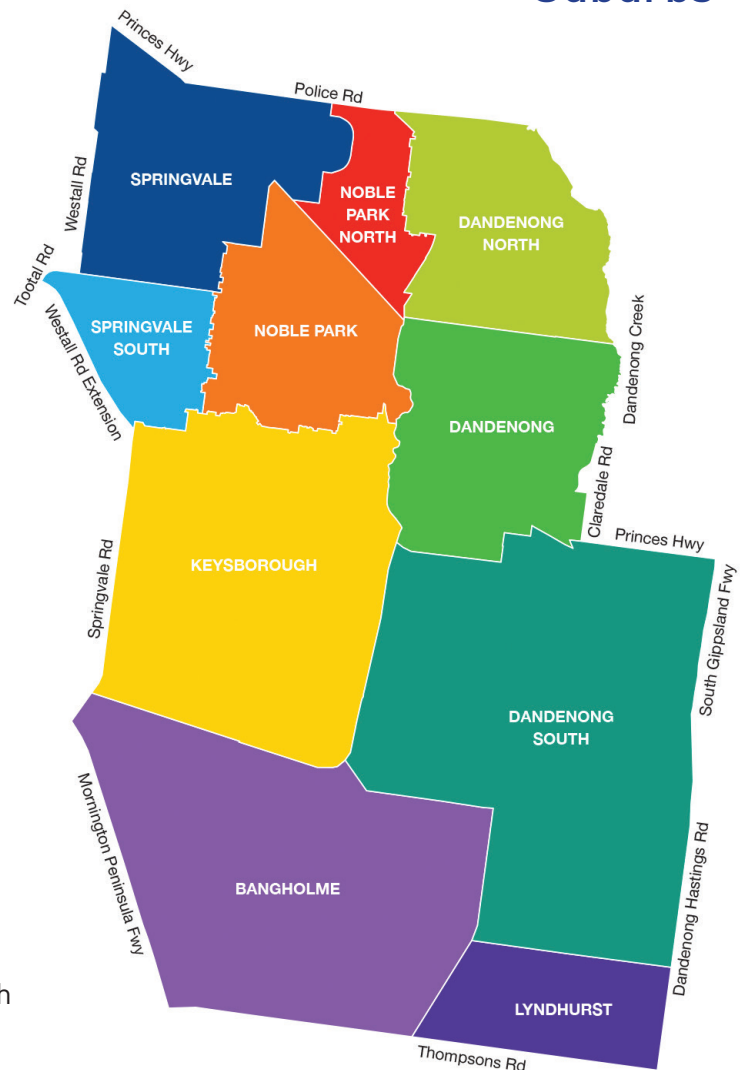
### Interpreter services

Contact council in your own language through the TIS (Translating and Interpreting Service) by phoning 13 14 50.

The Victorian interpreter card and interpreter symbol help residents with low English proficiency access language services, and help staff identify the need for language assistance and book interpreters.

When you see this sign it means that language assistance is available. Show your interpreter card to customer service staff to request language assistance. If you don't have a card, ask for one at a customer service centre, or simply point to the sign.

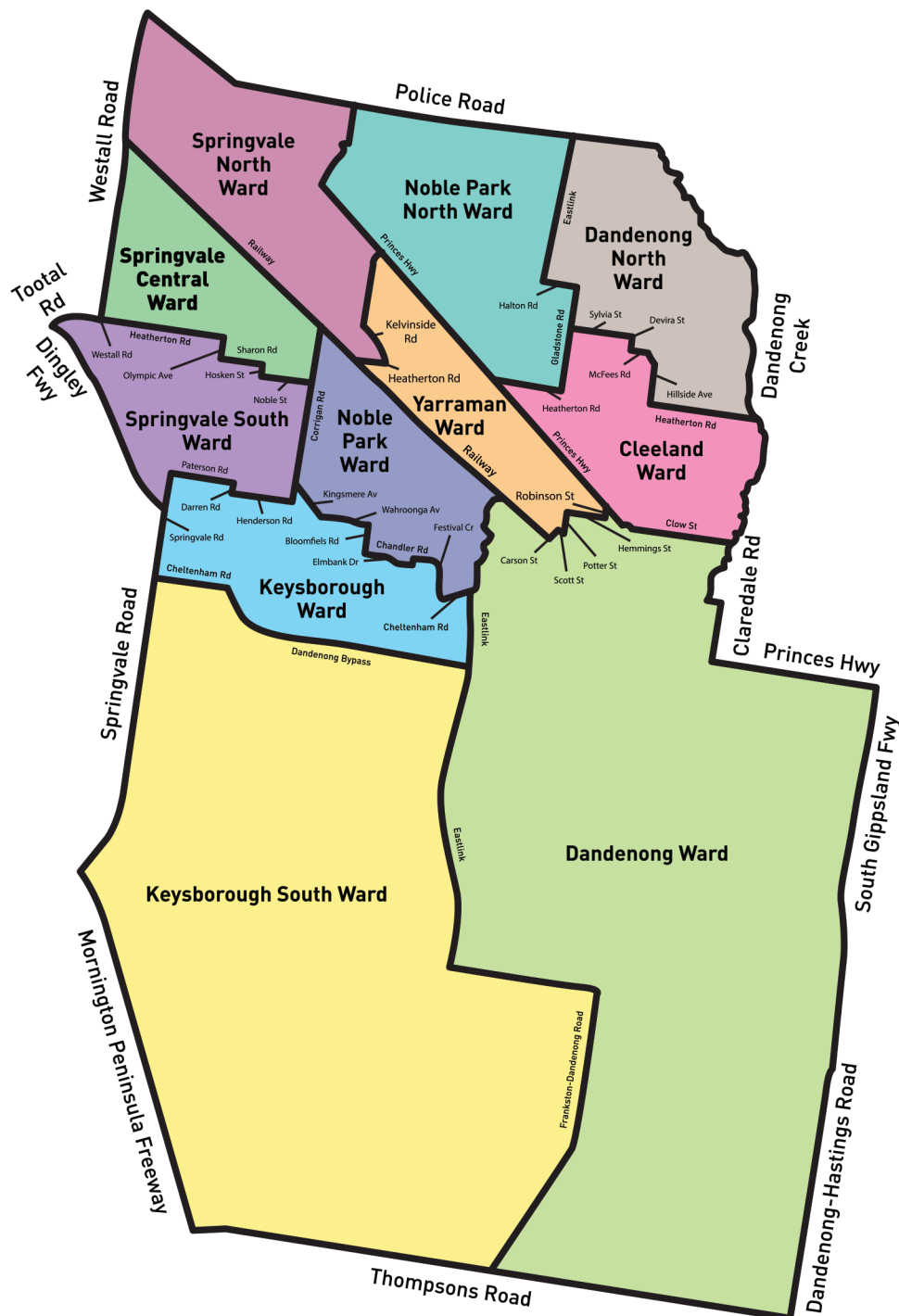

## Family and children's services

### Home library service

The City of Greater Dandenong Libraries provides a free home delivery service to residents unable to visit one of our branches in person. The Home Library Service is provided to eligible individuals in their own homes, to hostels and nursing homes.



# Your Home

## Pets

Council has a range of services catering for pet owners including discounted registration fees for desexed pets and local regulations to protect your pet.



### Microchipping pets

All cats and dogs being registered with Council for the first time must be microchipped. Speak to your vet for further information about microchipping.

### Register your pets

All cats and dogs over three months of age must be registered. New residents can make an application for registration prior to microchipping their pet. Please provide proof of microchipping within 28 days, to allow completion of the registration.

Pets must wear registration tags at all times. For registration costs and forms go to [greaterdandenong.vic.gov.au/pet-registration](http://greaterdandenong.vic.gov.au/pet-registration) or phone 8571 1000.

### Desexing your pet

Consider having your pet desexed to avoid unwanted puppies or kittens. It's also healthier for your pet. Registration discounts are available for desexed pets and pensioners can also get a discount on the cost of desexing.

### Lost pets

If you lose your pet or find a lost animal phone Council on 8571 1000, the pound on 9702 8055 or the Australian Animal Protection Society on 9798 8415.

## Laws for animal owners

It is your responsibility to care for your pet and make sure it is not a nuisance to other people or animals. There are a range of local laws that relate specifically to the number of animals on a property, confining your pet, animal noise, etc. If you have a pet please go to [greaterdandenong.vic.gov.au/pets-and-animals](http://greaterdandenong.vic.gov.au/pets-and-animals)

### Dog off-leash areas

All dogs must be on a leash at all times when not on your property, unless in a designated off-leash area.



## Rates

Rates are the annual levy Council charges property owners to fund the works and services it provides. All rateable properties are valued by Council's Property Revenue department.

The City of Greater Dandenong has a mandatory instalment payment option. Rates are payable in four instalments throughout the year.

## Waste services

Council provides a complete domestic waste service, including:

- weekly garbage collection
- fortnightly recycling collection
- fortnightly garden waste collection
- one 'at call' hard waste pickup per year.

Households are entitled to one hard waste collection per year and must call to book the service. To book a hard waste collection phone 9721 1915.

Planning to build or renovate? You may need a building or planning permit. A building permit is required before most building work. It is wise to check whether a planning permit is also needed as a building permit cannot be issued before required planning permits.

# Your Environment

## Laws and regulations

One of Council's key functions is to assist our community to live together in peace and harmony. Council makes local laws to assist in achieving this goal.

Local laws may be made in response to changes in State/Federal Law or in consultation with the community, based on local needs.



Council's authorised officers have a dual role - to educate the community about these laws and to promote compliance - to help keep our city a pleasant place to live, work and visit.
