

# Noble Park Local Business Competition - Little Day Out 2024

When you enter the “Noble Park Local Business – Little Day Out 2024” competition, your personal information will be collected and will be used by Greater Dandenong City Council (Council) for the sole purpose of selecting a prize winner.

## Terms and Conditions:

Submission of an entry is deemed acceptance of the following terms and conditions

Competition time: Monday 2 September - Sunday 15 September

How to enter:

1. Spend \$25 or more at selected stores within the Noble Park shopping precinct. This includes selected stores within Douglas St, Leonard Avenue, Buckley St, Mons Parade and Heatherton Rd.
2. Scan a QR code with the link to the survey; enter all requested details within the survey.
3. Upload a clear and legible copy of your receipt and submit your completed survey. Receipts must clearly show the store name, suburb, purchase date, and the amount spent. Illegible, incomplete, altered receipts, or receipts from stores considered to be outside of Noble Park will be deemed invalid.
4. Each valid receipt upload qualifies as one entry. Multiple entries will not be considered.

## Selection:

- Winner will be randomly selected on Monday 16 September from all valid entries received during the competition period.
- Winner will be contacted by Wednesday 18 September.
- If a winner cannot be contacted by 12pm Thursday 19 September, a new winner will be drawn and then contacted on the same day.

## General Conditions:

- Eligible QR codes can be found at participating stores within Noble Park
- Entrants must be 18 years and above.
- Entrants must reside in the state of Victoria, Australia. The winner will be required to provide proof of their residential address. If the winner is not able to provide this evidence, a new winner will be drawn.
- City of Greater Dandenong Councillors, Council employees and volunteers, and their immediate family members are not eligible to enter the draw.
- The City of Greater Dandenong is not responsible for any technical issues or errors that may affect the entry process.
- At its sole discretion Council reserves the right to:
  1. Disqualify any entrant deemed not to be in compliance with the Terms and Conditions of the entry requirements of this competition.
  2. Cancel, terminate or suspend the competition due to unforeseen circumstances or enforced laws.
