

Candidate Advertising Information and Management of Election Signage

The Greater Dandenong City Council controls the display and placement of political advertising in public spaces, on roads and within private property.

An apolitical Council

The Greater Dandenong City Council represents a diverse community which holds views across the political spectrum. In serving the interests of this community, Council does so without differentiating between individuals based on their political opinions, therefore Council cannot endorse, nor be seen to endorse, any individual candidate or political party. To this end, it is prohibited to conduct electioneering activities on Council land which would imply the endorsement or support of Council.

On Council Land

Election advertising signage on Council land and roads is strictly prohibited and includes:

- Signage
- Billboards
- Stationary trailers.
- Free standing signs
- A-Boards

On Private Land

Placement of political signage on private land is permitted under the following conditions:

- Consent is obtained from the landowner
- Signage display area does not exceed 5 square metres
- Only one sign may be displayed on the land
- Signage must not be animated or internally illuminated
- Signage must not be displayed for longer than 3 months from the date of erection or 14 days after the 26 October 2024, whichever is sooner.

If any of the above conditions cannot be met, then a permit may be required. For further information on obtaining a permit please visit Council's website:

Candidates whose signage is found in breach of the above requirements by an Authorised Officer will be asked to remove the signage immediately and may be subject to a planning infringement notice and issued a fine.
