

A harm reduction approach

Harm reduction is about reducing the negative health, social and economic consequence of drug use for the user, their families and the wider community, and encouraging safer behaviours through safer settings.

Alcohol and drug service support are available. Treatment and support services are effective in reducing risky alcohol and drug use.

Reducing harm in our community

Prevention and early intervention

Prevention and early intervention address issues before they become a serious problem.

Prevention focuses on stopping problems before they start. This can include education and awareness programs, community support services and policy changes.

Early intervention involves identifying and addressing problems early to prevent them from getting worse. This includes screening and assessments to spot issues, access to support services like counseling, educational support, families and caregivers support to manage the problems more effectively.

Pharmacotherapy

Pharmacotherapy is the use of legally prescribed medications to treat or manage health conditions, including addiction. Increasing access to pharmacotherapy helps to reduce drug dependence and reduce the health, social and economic harms to individuals and the community.

Community based treatment and support programs Needle and Syringe Program (NSP)

NSPs reduce harm by providing safer alternatives, education and support for individuals who use drugs. NSPs provide access to treatment and are designed to reduce the sharing of injecting equipment by providing sterile needles and syringes. This is a cost-effective way that has successfully prevented the spread of HIV and Hepatitis C infection.

Secure Dispensing Units (SDU)

SDU is a vending machine providing 24/7 access to free or low-cost injecting equipment and disposal containers.
