Council endorsed the name at the Monday 23 June Council Meeting following community consultation.

Greater Dandenong Mayor, Cr Jim Memeti said the confirmation of the name was an important milestone.

"The project has been informally known as the Keysborough South Community Hub and as the project nears completion, I am pleased to have a formal name confirmed for this new community facility," Cr Memeti said.

"I thank everyone who took the time to provide their feedback. Your input helped ensure the name of our new community hub reflects and serves the people of Keysborough."



Keysborough South Ward Councillor Isabella Do, welcomed the naming of the new community hub.

"It was wonderful to see so many residents actively participating in the naming process and sharing their opinions," Cr Do said.

"This is a significant milestone in our decade-long journey. We are incredibly excited to soon open our doors. The Hub is a testament to our community's hardearned advocacy and will be an inclusive and welcoming place for us to connect, learn and grow together."

The Keysborough Community Hub is set to open this month.

Works officially start on Dandenong Wellbeing Centre



Construction has started on the new Dandenong Wellbeing Centre at Mills

Reserve, Dandenong.

The centre will replace the ageing Dandenong Oasis and provide a place for community connection, health, water safety and fitness.

Greater Dandenong Mayor, Cr Jim Memeti recently joined with Cleeland Ward Councillor Rhonda Garad and Federal Member for Bruce, Julian Hill, to turn the first sod at the site.

Cr Memeti said the project was not just about concrete and construction, but about people.

"This is the single largest investment Council has ever made in our city and I'm incredibly proud it's an investment in health, wellbeing, inclusion and water safety," Cr Memeti said.

"This centre will provide a place where everyone – no matter their age, culture or ability – can connect, move and thrive." The creation of a time capsule to install at the new centre will preserve the history of the nearly 50-year-old aquatic centre and how much it has meant to the people.

"So many members of our community have incredible memories of Dandenong Oasis and we will continue to collect these to reflect on the past and celebrate visions for the future,"

Cr Memeti said.

The Federal Government has contributed \$20 million to the Dandenong Wellbeing Centre. Federal Bruce MP Julian Hill said the project "is all about bringing world-class infrastructure into the heart of Melbourne's southeast for generations to come, helping families keep active without having to leave their neighbourhood".



The new centre will open in 2027. Visit greaterdandenong. vic.gov.au/DWC to keep up to date on the project.

Keysborough Ward



Weekend sport is popular in Greater Dandenong, and Keysborough's own Rowley

Allan Reserve has seen many improvements to the facilities over recent years.

The reserve accommodates netball, Australian Rules Football, cricket and lawn bowls, and recent upgrades have ensured the grounds meet the community's needs now and into the future. The Rowley Allan Reserve Concept Plan was adopted by Council in 2021, after extensive consultation with users and the wider community.

Recent upgrades have included lighting for both the main oval and netball courts, coaches boxes and fencing. Picnic seating and shelters have also been added to the reserve, making the space more inviting. The 2025-26 Budget outlines further funding to support drainage upgrades to the exterior of the pavilion and a new coaches box on the main oval.



Council is committed to supporting all people within our community, but we understand that some are doing it tough. This winter many of our resident will have to make the difficult decision between putting the heater on or putting food on the table, and I ask that all residents think about how they might support those who are more vulnerable.

There are many agencies in our community that offer support in a crisis, including for those with housing issues, food insecurity or mental health needs. I have been volunteering with the Kindness Community, which offers weekly meals, connection and support to homeless and disadvantaged people in Greater Dandenong.

The service offers a free meal every Tuesday at Hemmings Park, 61A Princes Highway, Dandenong (next to the skate park). The beautiful volunteers also provide a friendly, safe space and referrals to support services for those who need it. share the wonderful work happening across Greater Dandenong.

Recently in Noble Park we celebrated the completion of an upgrade to Greenglade Reserve. Visitors to the park will have seen the new play equipment, furniture and landscaping, making it a more inviting space for all.

Upgrades to the kindergarten and childcare space at the Paddy O'
Donoghue Centre have also been completed. This centre, which has been a part of the community for 100 years, will continue to support local families.

Recently the Malaysian community hosted a winter night market at the Frank Street Open Space, which was completed last year. The event was very successful and is exactly what this space was designed for.

The Noble Park Little Library Lockers project is close to completion. The lockers will be installed at the Noble Park

Train Station in the coming months and will be available for use before the end of the year.

In 2025-26 Council has committed funding to complete stage 1 of an offsite car park at Noble Park Reserve.

The biggest project happening in Noble Park at the moment is the construction of 97 social housing apartments at 51A Douglas Street. This project will help boost affordable housing and will assist vulnerable people including those escaping family violence. These homes are expected to welcome new residents next year.

Following the removal of two River Red Gum trees from the site the developer has contributed \$155,000 to support planting efforts across the suburb. This month 180 new street trees will be planted across Noble Park.

Finally, I am looking forward to the opening of the highly anticipated Keysborough Community Hub. It will be a great resource for the community and I can't wait to see it open.

We delivered: Capital Works projects 2024-25

Greater Dandenong City Council's 2024–25 Budget featured a capital works program valued at \$93.47 million.

With a focus on service sustainability and the need to maintain ageing infrastructure, we also invested in new community facilities.

Here are some highlights of the capital works projects we delivered over the past 12 months.

Major Projects



Designed with and for the community, **Keysborough**

Community Hub is home to maternal and child health support, a community lounge with a library and multipurpose community spaces inside and out. The hub will open to the community this month, and in 2026 will introduce kindergarten and day care services. The \$29.5 million project was constructed over two years following extensive consultation in 2021

Plans for the **Dandenong**Wellbeing Centre, a once-in-ageneration investment, progressed in 2024-25 with the construction contract awarded. Works recently began to deliver the Dandenong Wellbeing Centre, a space for people to connect, socialise and take care of their health year-round. The centre is due to be completed in 2027.

The \$500,000 Lyndale Secondary College Pavilion project included refurbishment of the canteen servery and surrounds with new commercial kitchen appliances, extra storage, seating and improved drainage.



Dandenong Market is one of Melbourne's oldest markets and has been operating since 1866. It is at the heart of community life in Greater Dandenong and we are committed to preserving it for the future. Over the past year we made changes to the Clow Street carparking area, including additional parking for people with disabilities and parents. We also improved family toilets within the Market Bazaar.







Parks and Reserves



The City of Greater Dandenong is home to more than 100 parks, sports reserves and playgrounds. Each year we maintain more than 600 hectares of open space.

Improvements over the past year include:

We invested \$1.2 million to help light up local sporting grounds, ensuring more people have access to sport. This included Greaves Reserve, Dandenong, Lois Twohig Reserve, Dandenong North, Thomas Carroll Reserve, Dandenong and Rosswood Tennis Club, Dandenong.

The **Parkfield Reserve Tennis Courts** were reconstructed at a cost of \$900,000, giving the community better playing facilities.

A total of **2389 trees** were planted as part of our Urban Tree Strategy in a bid to increase our total canopy cover.



We spent \$1.03 million to complete upgrades to five local playgrounds, including at Barry Powell Reserve, Noble Park North, Greenglade Pocket Park, Noble Park, Greaves Reserve, Dandenong, Linden Drive Pocket Park, Keysborough and Railway Parade Pocket Park, Noble Park. We also installed 400sq meters of new shade sail at Keysborough's Pencil Park.

Roads

We are committed to improving safety on our roads and each year we invest in road upgrades and maintenance.

Over the past year we completed stage 2 of the **Perry Road Upgrade**. Drivers have benefited from the completed roadworks, which have helped reduce congestion, improve road safety and strengthened the road to cope with commercial vehicle traffic. Footpath and landscaping upgrades have also improved access for pedestrians and cyclists. The third and final stage of the project will be

A pollutant trap installed at Olinda Reserve is helping to stop litter and debris from the Springvale CBD from entering the stormwater. The \$430,000 project will help protect our precious waterways and creeks.

A \$17 million investment in road upgrades resulted in the renewal and improvement of around 80 road sections, covering about 20km of road across Greater Dandenong. Key industrial roads included in these projects included Ordish Road, Produce Drive, Swift Way, Elliott Road and Hammond Road.

Federal **Blackspot Funding** worth \$2 million helped us deliver critical road safety improvements at locations with a history of crashes. Projects delivered over the last year included Railway Parade, Noble Park, View Road, Springvale, Brady Road, Dandenong North, Athol Road, Springvale and Woodlee Street, Dandenong.

Behind the Scenes at Council

Meet Irina Tourovsky, a Senior Project Manager

Tell us about what you do at Council?

I manage complex civil construction projects which includes road rehabilitation and reconstruction, drainage installation/upgrade/ maintenance, bridge construction/ maintenance, overhead and underground services alteration, lighting upgrades, landscaping and other civil works. One of my current major projects is the upgrade to Perry Road, Keysborough, which is entering its third and final stage this year.

What is the most rewarding thing about your job?

The most rewarding thing is to be able to employ my knowledge and experience to provide service to our multicultural Greater Dandenong community. I like that I am helping to deliver new infrastructure and upgrade aged infrastructure, as well as overseeing projects from initiation stage through to development and



delivery stages. I like combining established and innovative building practices and materials to achieve better outcomes and prolong the life of infrastructure that our community use every day.

What does a typical week look like?

My work is varied but a typical week could include consulting with the community, inspecting existing infrastructure and exchanging ideas with colleagues to seek the best solutions. I can also be found preparing briefs, and managing projects including

through the design, development and implementation stages. I also help to manage tenders and assess their outcomes, including the awarding and managing of contracts.

Why did you pursue a career in this field?

I grew up in a small city (Mozyr in Belarus) which was under rapid development, and I could see how engineers made positive changes to infrastructure, including the construction of new roads, bridges, buildings and expansion of the city. I have always been surrounded by engineers, and I was fascinated hearing their discussions about engineering solutions. I went to university in Moscow to study engineering and have continued to study to improve my knowledge throughout my career.

What do you like to do in your free time?

I like spending time with my family and friends – walking/hiking and going to the beach. I also love to organise interesting trips and travel to experience different cultures, learn other countries' histories, admire nature and architecture.

Pioneering the way for women in the steel industry



Maria Mavrikos has worked in the steel fabrication industry for more than 30 years and is passionate about helping other women thrive in the industry, just as she did.

In 2000, Maria established Structural Challenge, a steel fabrication company specialising in commercial and infrastructure projects. The Dandenong South business employs 80 staff.

Last year, Maria launched Steel Chicks, a social enterprise working to increase women's participation in the steel industry.

"Steel Chicks is a passion project for me," said Maria. "The steel fabrication industry is very much a boys' club, so I didn't really have much support when I started. I wanted to do something where women can come together and network and have training and support within the industry."

From humble beginnings in Melbourne, Steel Chicks now has members all over Australia, as well as strong industry partnerships.

Membership is open to anyone who shares the goal of supporting women in the industry. Members gain access to Steel Chicks events, training and a free mentoring program. Steel Chicks also facilitates work experience opportunities for school students and is very active in the apprenticeship space.

Maria says there's a lot of work being done to change the perception of the industry among females and the message is slowly gaining traction.

"There are a lot of different career paths within the industry," she said.

"You can start at entry level and move up into a technical or managerial role reasonably quickly if you have the right attitude. The career pathways include trade-based and technical roles such as engineering, to administration roles such as contract and project management. The steel industry offers ample opportunity, and it's a great industry to work in."
