Re-use and Recycle Drop Off Day

Discover Dandenong Creek Festival

Discover Dandenong Creek Festival is held in Tirhatuan Park and attracts attendees of all ages and abilities.

You can take part in wildlife demonstrations, craft and science activities and learn how you can help protect the Dandenong Creek and surrounding areas.



Food and garden organics bin

You can recycle food scraps by putting them into the green lid food and garden organics bin.

Your foods scraps are turned into compost to improve the soil for our farmers and the parks and gardens right here in Greater Dandenong.

All types of foods, cooked and raw, can be placed in the green lid bin. But be sure not to add any plastic including bags, stickers or rubber bands.

If you don't have a green lid bin you can add one to your waste service.

Batteries don't go in any bin

When batteries are put in household bins, they can cause fires in your bins and the trucks that collect them.

This includes AA and button batteries, as well as car batteries and those from laptops, mobile phones, power tools, cameras and toys.

Batteries also contain toxic substances that can leak into waterways and the environment causing health problems in humans and animals.

Keep your home safe and protect the planet. Recycle your batteries at drop-off points across Greater Dandenong, including most supermarkets.


Battery safety at home

- Tape the ends of used batteries
- Store them in a fire-safe container like a glass jar (keep the lid loose for airflow)
- Keep all batteries away from children

Have fun with nature play and craft activities in the Sense Trail or take a tour of the reserve with one of our rangers.






Hard Rubbish Collection

No one wants to live around piles of rubbish. Dumped rubbish ruins the look of our streets and open spaces. It's harmful to the environment and if you're caught dumping rubbish you will be fined.

Getting your rubbish collected is free and easy. Book your free annual hard rubbish collection to take away your broken and unwanted larger household items, including:



Furniture



Electronic appliances



Timber (no longer than 1.5 metres and no more than 10 pieces)



Mattresses and bed bases (maximum of two bases)



Carpet (rolled and tied, no longer than 1.5 metres)



Scrap metal including small car parts and empty paint tins



Whitegoods such as washing machines, ovens, fridges and hot water systems

Recycling Beyond the bin

Some items don't belong in your household bins.

This includes e-waste—anything with a plug, cord or battery. Examples are phones, TVs, computers, kitchen appliances, toys and garden tools.

Many of these items can still be recycled, just not in your kerbside bin. Recycling them helps keep useful materials out of landfill so they can be used again to make new things.




To find out what to do with these items, search the **Recycle Mate guide** on our website.



Keep your recycling loose

Your yellow lid recycling bin is the start of the recycling process.

You can recycle these five materials in your yellow lid kerbside bin

- Glass bottles and jars
- Metal and aluminium containers
- Paper and cardboard
- Hard plastic bottles and containers

Follow these handy tips to recycle right at home

- Place items loosely in the recycling bin
- Use a tub or other container to collect items for recycling
- Rinse out containers and put the lids back on
- Flatten or cut cardboard packaging into smaller pieces
- Do not put recycling in plastic bags. Items in bags can't be processed by sorting facilities, even if all the items are recyclable

These simple steps will increase the everyday products made with recycled materials and keep valuable materials out of landfill.


Container Deposit Scheme

Have you heard of the Container Deposit Scheme?

You can get 10 cents back for drink containers that you recycle.

Drop off cans and bottles made from aluminium, glass, plastic and even small juice boxes made from liquid paperboard, at one of many convenient locations.

Leave the lids on, but do not crush your containers or remove the labels as these are needed to register your refund.


