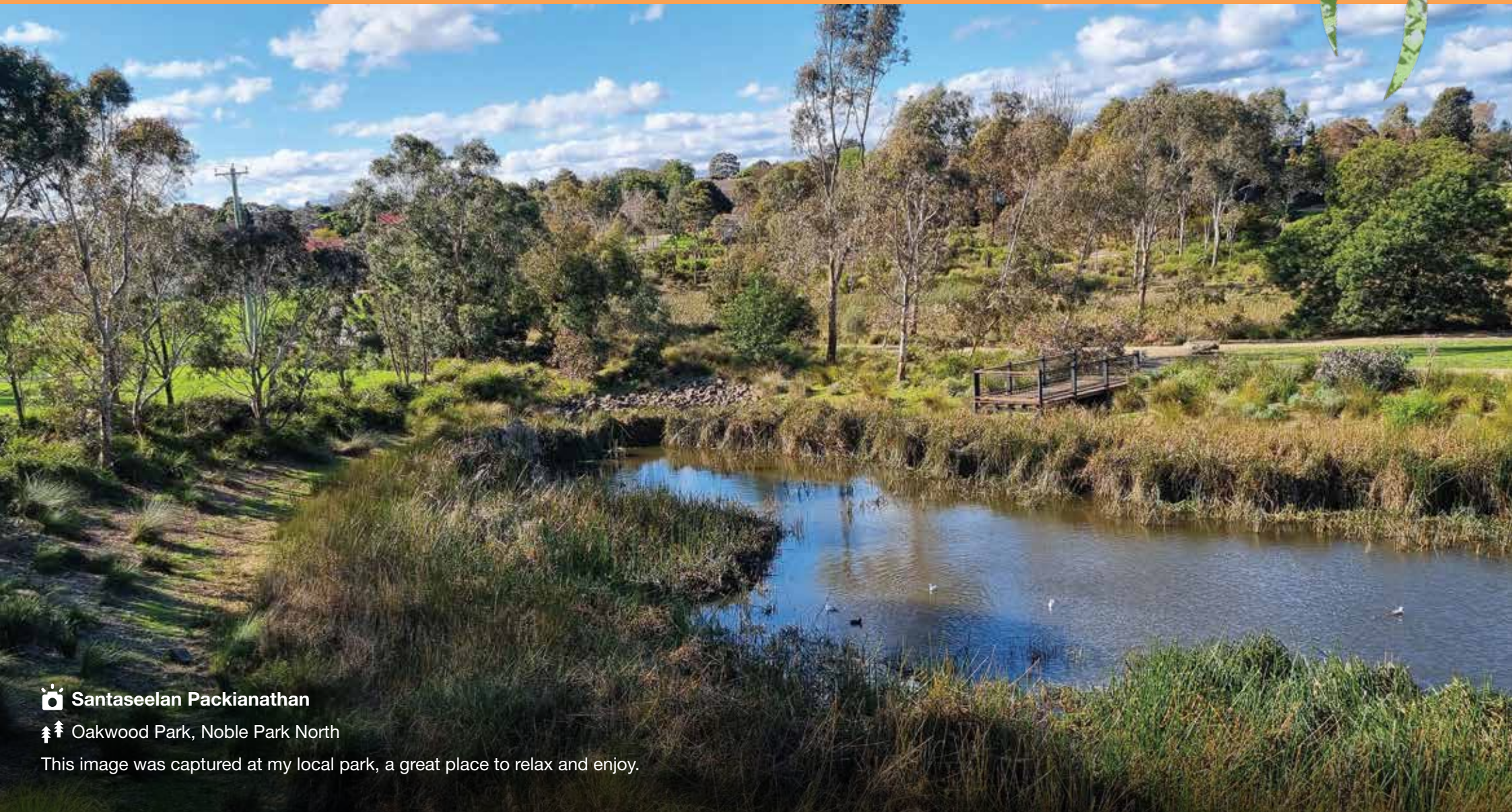




DECEMBER

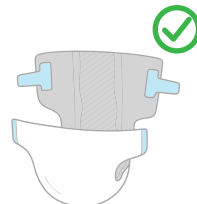

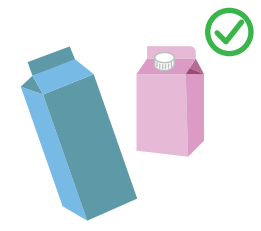

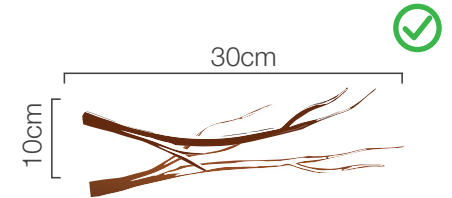

Waste collection reminders

1. Make sure all bin lids are closed to prevent litter.
2. Bins must be no heavier than 80kg. If it's too heavy to wheel to the kerb, it's too heavy for the truck to empty.
3. To ensure your bin is collected, place your bins out after 4pm the day before your collection but no later than 5am on collection day. We will not return to empty your bins if they are not out at the time of collection.
4. Avoid parking in the street on collection day.
5. Additional bins are available on a user pays basis.
6. Report damaged or stolen bins to Council on 8571 1000. There is no cost to the resident for a replacement or repairs to the bin.



Report illegal dumping It's in your hands

A cleaner Greater Dandenong is in your hands. To report dumped rubbish and littering phone 8571 1000 and provide as many details as possible.

Helpful information includes:



The location of the dumped rubbish.



The date and time you saw the rubbish being dumped.



Any identifying details such as the vehicle make, colour and registration.

The Victorian State Government is banning problematic single-use plastics by February 2023

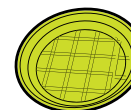
The ban: which single-use plastics are included?

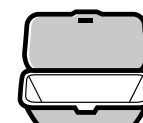

We're encouraging Victorians to choose to reuse now and we're getting ready for the ban.

We're working with industry and local government to support the transition to reusable products and we'll publicly consult on and finalise the regulations. The ban commences in February 2023.

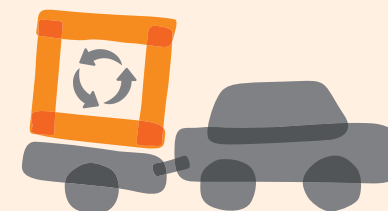

Waste and Recycling Disposal Centres

Transfer stations and recycling centres



Council does not operate a landfill site (rubbish tip) or transfer station. There are a number of waste and recycling disposal facilities near Greater Dandenong that residents can use. If you have additional waste, you can dispose of this at a local transfer station for a small cost. Recyclable items such as cardboard, bottles and batteries can usually be disposed of free of charge at most recycling centres. It is always best to call first to confirm opening hours and fees.

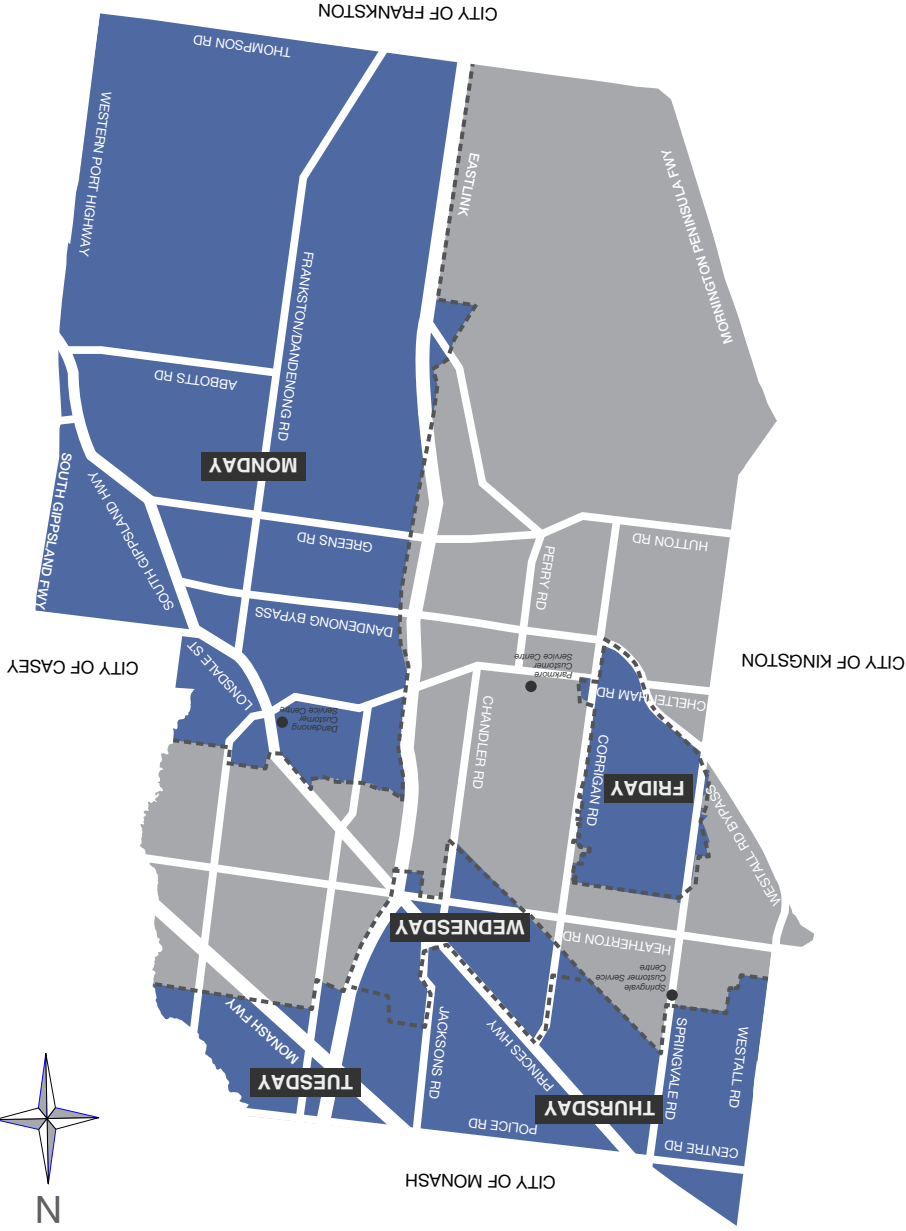
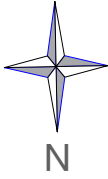
