



The Victorian State Government is banning problematic single-use plastics by February 2023

# The ban: which single-use plastics are included?

# Health and safety exemptions

The ban will not affect medical or scientific equipment, emergency management services, or people who require specific single-use plastic products due to disability or for health and safety.

We're encouraging Victorians to choose to reuse now and we're getting ready for the ban.

We're working with industry and local government to support the transition to reusable products and we'll publicly consult on and finalise the regulations. The ban commences in February 2023.

# Transfer stations and recycling centres



Council does not operate a landfill site (rubbish tip) or transfer station. There are a number of waste and recycling disposal facilities near Greater Dandenong that residents can use. If you have additional waste, you can dispose of this at a local transfer station for a small cost. Recyclable items such as cardboard, bottles and batteries can usually be disposed of free of charge at most recycling centres. It is always best to call first to confirm opening hours and fees.
