Greater Dandenong City Council asked the community to have their say on the draft Concept Plan for the new neighbourhood playground at Thomas Carroll Reserve, Dandenong which will replace the existing playground and also be relocated to the north side of the carpark, as seen in the photo above.

The community consultation on the draft concept was open for a four-week period from 22 August - 23 September 2022. Refer to page 3 to view the draft concept plan.

Various methods were used to promote and seek feedback on the concept plan.

The consultation included:

- · Notification posters within Thomas Carroll Reserve
- · Information on Council's website
- Online survey via Survey Monkey (general public)
- Online survey for children via Survey Monkey
- In class presentations with school children at St Mary's Primary School and Dandenong Primary School.

Children's School Classroom Presentations

The development of the ideas for the draft concept plan was informed by the consultation undertaken with school children from St Mary's Primary School and Dandenong Primary School. There were 54 children who participated in these in classroom presentations.

- 18 students from Dandenong Primary School Monday 29th August
- 36 students from St Mary's Primary School Thursday 25th August

There were two in-class presentations facilitated by Council's Children's Services Development Officer and Council's Landscape Architect. The in-class presentations on the draft concept plan for the playground were based on the children's survey questions.

Council officers asked the students to answer a series of questions with accompanying images on their preferences for different playground equipment elements and preferred colour theme. There was also an opportunity for open discussion and general feedback.

The feedback from these in-class presentations and the follow up children's online survey were used to inform and develop the revised final Concept for the Thomas Carroll Reserve playground.

Council received

- 2 survey responses online survey (general survey)
- · 89 survey responses online children's survey
- In class presentations 36 students from St Mary's Primary School and 18 students from Dandenong Primary School.








1 - Do you agree with the concept plan Council has developed?




2 - Do you agree with the equipment examples Council has provided?











5 - What is your children's age group?



1 - What grade are you in? (online survey)










5 - Which climbing elements are you most excited by? Select your favourite




Climbing and resting at the top was a clear vote winner.



7 - Which spinner would you like to see in the new playground? Pick you two favourite spinners




Rotating swings, where kids can sit and spin around with friends received the popular vote.







9 - How fun does this look? 4m high standard swing







80 - 90% 85 There was a mixed response to how fun these tall swings would be.

There was still strong agreement that the 4m high standard swing would be a fun piece of equipment to play on.


10 - Which slide do you have most fun on?







11 - Pick your favourite play element







Overall Summary of Responses

SUMMARY

Overall, there was a very high level of support from the community, especially the school students for the draft concept design proposed for the new neighbourhood playground. The majority of people agreed with the draft concept and proposed equipment. There were some excellent comments and suggestions received from the children's survey and the in-class presentations relating to the playground equipment and other ideas for the park which have been captured earlier in this report.

In summary, the key responses related to the following:

1. Playground Equipment

- Children place a high level of importance on swings, slides and different types of diverse climbing elements in a playground.
- Slides and swings are two of the most popular pieces of playground equipment.
- · Spiral slides and double slides were viewed as being especially fun.
- The more variety in the type of slide, height and colour, the more fun there is!
- There was overwhelming agreement that the giant 360 degree basket swing would be a fun piece of equipment to play on.
- Activity towers that have different heights, rope bridges between sections, climbing walls and other climbing equipment and a variety of other activities are very popular.
- Obstacle style ropes provide challenging and fun play options for kids.
- Climbing elements that you can climb and rest at the top were seen as offering a high level of enjoyment.
- Slides, flexible gangways and climbing walls were all close in the votes received. Monkey bars were also popular.
- Rotating swings, where kids can sit and spin around with friends received the popular vote.
- Other rotating elements that kids can hang off and spin or a type of rotating carousel spinner were also seen as fun in a playground.
- Games panels are popular a cubby house and games panels were viewed as the key favourites

2. Playground Colour Theme

· Green, turquoise and blue will be used as the colour theme for the playground

Post Consultation - Revised Final Concept Plan

The main themes and ideas that emerged from the school children's and community's comments to the two surveys and in the in-class presentations have provided council officers with clear direction on the design improvements and opportunities that are required to finalise the neighbourhood playground design.

As an outcome of the comments and council officer's assessment of the feasibility of the ideas, the following elements will be addressed and included in the revised final design for the playground.

These elements are:

- · The inclusion of a two person rotating and bouncing spinner
- The inclusion of a cubby house and games panels for young children
- The detailed design of the activity tower will take into account the more specific elements, such as
 different types of slides (spiral and enclosed), rope climbing net structure, net bridges, climbing walls,
 interactive panels and diversity of play components.

The colour of the playground will be green, turquoise and blue.

The revised final concept plan for the playground can be viewed below and on the following page.
