Transfer Stations and Recycling Centres

If you need to part ways with something that's trickier to dispose of, such as a cut down tree or you have more garden waste than your green lid food and garden bin can handle, there are transfer stations (tips) near the Greater Dandenong area. A transfer station is a place where you can drop off your waste to be disposed of or recycled. Some items are free to take to a transfer station and some things you must pay for. See the back of this calendar to find your nearest transfer station.




World Environment Day


AUGUST

Stormwater drains

Stormwater drains collect rainwater run-off from roads, roofs and gutters, as well as anything lightweight on the ground. All sorts of litter including cigarette butts, food and drink packaging, and polystyrene are carried in the run-off into the stormwater drains. In Australia, the stormwater system is separate from the sewer system. Unlike sewage, stormwater is not treated before being discharged to our waterways. Stormwater drains lead into rivers and creeks, and then to our bays and oceans. Not only is litter unsightly — it has devastating impacts on wildlife.

Booking hard rubbish

Greater Dandenong residents are entitled to one free hard waste collection each financial year. The hard waste service is 'at call', meaning you can book a collection when it suits you. The maximum amount of waste you can put out for collection is three cubic metres. You can put your hard waste collection inside your property in your front yard if you can, so others don't add to it — this is the preferred option. 

Garbage bins are emptied weekly (same day each week).

Yes, we accept these items in the red garbage bin:



Ceramics and broken glass



Nappies



Make sure you bag your garbage

Waste collection reminders

1. Make sure all bin lids are closed to prevent litter.

Food scraps

No nappies

- 2. Bins must be no heavier than 80kg. If it's too heavy to wheel to the kerb, it's too heavy for the truck to empty.
- 3. To ensure your bin is collected, place your bins out after 4pm the day before your collection but no later than 5am on collection day. We will not return to empty your bins if they are not out at the

time of collection.

- **4.** Avoid parking in the street on collection day.
- **5.** Additional bins are available on a user pays basis.
- **6.** Report damaged or stolen bins to Council on 8571 1000. There is no cost to the resident for a replacement or repairs to the bin.



Report illegal dumping It's in your hands

A cleaner Greater Dandenong is in your hands. To report dumped rubbish and littering phone 8571 1000 and provide as many details as possible.

Any identifying details such as the vehicle make, colour and registration.

Transfer Stations and Recycling Centres



Greater Dandenong does not have a Council owned rubbish tip or transfer station. There are a few waste and recycling disposal facilities near Greater Dandenong that residents can use. Your additional waste can be taken to a local transfer station for a small cost. Recyclable items such as cardboard, bottles and batteries can usually be taken free of charge at most recycling centres.

It is always best to call first to confirm opening hours and if there are any disposal fees.






