Travellers Aid assists people who require assistance when they are travelling or visiting Melbourne.

They are committed to ensuring that all Victorians can participate and have a team from a diverse range of backgrounds.

They operate from three service sites at Southern Cross and Flinders Street Stations in Melbourne and Seymour Railway Station in regional Victoria.

Services are provided with the highest level of care, respect and dignity and are designed to enable travellers with special requirements to fully participate in life activities.

How can they help?



Connection Assistance

A free Connection Assistance service assisting people transiting through Southern Cross Station and Seymour Station.



Crisis Travel

Travel assistance for people experiencing disadvantage or facing an emergency situation.



Mobility Equipment Hire

Electric scooters, manual wheelchairs, prams, walking canes and frames, crutches and more.



Personal Care

Assists people with a disability, impairment or are frail-aged when travelling through Southern Cross and Flinders Street Stations.



Companion Service

Trained volunteer companions to accompany people to and from essential appointments and services.



Station Lounges

Travel information, internet access, mobility equipment recharging, shower facilities, rest rooms and more.



Flu and COVID Vaccines

Annual Influenza vaccines are available from mid-April.

The flu vaccine is available for free to:

- people aged 65 years and older
- people with medical conditions putting them at increased risk including those with
 - o cardiac disease
 - chronic respiratory conditions
 - chronic neurological conditions
 - immunocompromising conditions
 - diabetes and other metabolic disorders
 - renal disease
 - haematological disorders.

Along with influenza vaccination it is important to stay up-to-date with COVID-19 vaccinations including boosters. Influenza vaccines can be given on the same day as a COVID-19 vaccine.

National Advance Care Planning Week 20-26 March 2023

The time is now to talk about what matters most to you.

National Advance Care Planning Week encourages you, regardless of your age or health status, to make your future health care preferences known.

The campaign challenges everyone to discuss what living well means to you and to consider who you would want to speak for you, if you could no longer communicate or make your own health care decisions.

It's been successful in starting tough but important conversations across the country.

What is advance planning?

Advance care planning involves planning for your future health care. It enables you to make some decisions now about the health care you would or would not like to receive if you were to become seriously ill and unable to communicate your preferences or make treatment decisions.

Advance care planning helps to ensure your loved ones and health providers know what matters most to you and respect your treatment preferences.

How do I get started?

There are three things you need to do to start advance care planning.

Be open - start thinking about your health, values and preferences.

Be ready - talk with family members or those closet to you.

Be heard - share your preferences to be ready for the future

Help paying your bills

There are many reasons you may struggle to pay your energy bills:

- higher energy prices
- change in income
- you're already experiencing financial distress.

There are a few things you can do to help.

Talk to your energy company

Energy companies usually have a hardship team. This team will be able to discuss your assistance options, such as paying smaller amounts more often or delaying the payment of a bill.

Concessions and grants

Eligible concession cardholders can receive discounts on their energy bills and you may also be entitled to a grant to help pay your bill.

\$250 Power Saving Bonus Payment

A new round of the Power Saving Bonus program will commence on 24 March 2023. Victorian households will be able to receive a new \$250 payment, including any households that received a payment through the current round. You can apply for the new \$250 payment by returning to the website from 24 March 2023.

If you haven't yet applied for the current round of the \$250 Power Saving Bonus applications for the current round can be submitted up until midnight on 23 March 2023.
